## **Lantern Festival**

The Lantern festival has been part of Chinese New Year celebrations since the Han Dynasty (206 BC- 221 AD). Usually held on the 15th day of the first month of the lunar calendar, it marks the end of New Year festivities.

People hang lanterns outside their homes and many cities hold big Lantern festivals. The lanterns come in all sizes and shapes, including animals, insects, flowers, and mythical figures. A favourite subject is the zodiac animal of the year, which according to the Chinese calendar will be the Dog in 2018 and the Pig in 2019.



Today, Lantern festivals are held in many countries around the world, including New Zealand.



## Language

Each syllable of every word in Mandarin has an accompanying tone. There are four main tones (high, rising, falling-rising, and falling) and a fifth neutral tone. The tones help people tell between words that would otherwise sound the same.

Chinese characters are the oldest continually used system of writing in the world. There are tens of thousands of characters – though to read a newspaper, for instance, you only need to know about 2000-3000.
